For Your Consideration

I received a phone call from Omaha the other day. A Christian who works at an interfaith campus combining a church, synagogue, and a mosque wanted to talk about last year's God Survey.

She wanted to know how and why we created the survey at Sinai. She was planning to use our survey in her "tri-faith" community.

A fascinating idea, I thought. But as we talked, I suggested that she read over our Sinai questions very carefully. My advice was that she shouldn't plan on simply transferring our vocabulary over to a multi-faith population. As "neutral" as I believe our survey wording was, I'm quite sure that faith and belief have very different nuances in different traditions. Christians and Moslems use many of the same words we Jews do, but the context and the understanding aren't the same.

Which leads to an interesting question for us at Sinai: What will the results of our new survey on Israel reveal about our own community?

Will we largely agree on the meaning of Israel in our lives? Will some of us be passionate supporters of Israel while others find Israel quite inscrutable? Will most of us be "pro-Israel?" or will we speak about Israel in cautious or even negative terms?

This Friday, November 2 after the 6 p.m. service and the dinner that follows I want to share the preliminary results of our Israel Survey with you. I'm eager to do so because, when we talk about Israel, we explore a different dimension of Jewish identity. If the God Survey focused on the spiritual, this Israel Survey takes us over to the ethnic, cultural side of Jewish life. For many Jews, this latter expression of Judaism is what works best. As you've probably said yourself many times, "I'm proud to be a Jew. I'm proud of our history."

Israel and its almost 65 year history may be a large or small aspect of your Jewish pride. On November 2, let's see what over 225 congregants think.

Let's consider what role Israel plays in making us the kind of Jews we are in 2012.


Notes from the Cantor

Message from Heather Sullivan Director of Education

Shalom,

One of the goals that I had set out for myself when I accepted the position as the Director of Education was to build upon the sense of camaraderie at Sinai Temple. When I am a student at Sinai, I feel secure in taking risks where my fellow classmates have so much in common with me. When I am a teacher at Sinai, I witness the bonding between senior members of our congregation and Grade 8 students. The Time Capsules of the Warsaw Ghetto: On the Seventieth Anniversary -The Secret Archive Revealed Sunday morning, November 4 at 9:15 a.m. Dr. Samuel Kassow, Trinity College

(Sponsored by Men of Sinai. Breakfast will be served.)



Samuel Kassow is the world's leading authority on Emanuel Ringelblum, who established a secret organization named Oyneg Shabes in Nazi-occupied Warsaw in 1940. Retrieved after World War II from metal boxes and milk cans buried beneath the ruins of the Warsaw ghetto, the Oyneg

Shabes-Ringelblum Archive records and preserves the fate of Polish Jewry.

A prolific author, Professor Kassow's Who Will Write Our History? Emanuel Rinelblum, the Warsaw Ghetto, and the Oyneg Shabes Archive (2007) received the Orbis Prize and was a finalist for a National Jewish Book Award. A child of Holocaust survivors, Professor Kassow was born in a Displaced Persons camp in Germany. Kassow is Professor of History in Trinity College, holds a Ph.D. from Princeton University, and is a consultant to the Museum of the History of Polish Jews to be built in Warsaw.

Gay, Lesbian, Bi-sexual, and Transsexual: How our Culture is Changing Jennifer Levi, Professor of Law, Western New England University Sunday, December 2 at 9:30 a.m.



On December 2, family rights attorney and GLAD advocate Jennifer Levi will be the featured speaker at the monthly Men of Sinai breakfast.

Professor Levi has dedicated her career to fighting for the rights of women; children; the poor; and gay, lesbian, bisexual,

and transgendered clients. Most recently, Professor Levi was Senior Staff Attorney for Gay and Lesbian Advocates and Defenders in Boston. Levi served as Co-counsel for the seven same-sex couples who sued the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for denying them the right to obtain marriage licenses in Goodridge et al v. the Department of Public Health. The appeal led to the landmark Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court ruling that stated it was unconstitutional for the Commonwealth to deny gays and lesbians the right to marry.

What if the "miracle" of Chanukah led us to use less oil in our day? Can we help today's world conserve energy? Perhaps we can rethink all those bags for Chanukah gifts and food?

Remember, a chanukiyah (a menorah for Chanukah)
has 8 candles + 1 shamash (the candle that lights the others).
Let your creative juices run wild.

Chanukah Questions and Answers

When is Chanukah?

Chanukah begins Saturday night, December 8. The last candle is lit Saturday night, December 15.

How do we observe Chanukah today?

Chanukah is almost entirely a time for celebration, although it can be more than that. This year, for example, how about implementing the "tradition" of Ner Shel Tzedakah, which means dedicating one "ner/candle/night" to tzedakah. Make Friday, December 14 different by giving gifts of tzedakah.

How do we prepare the candles when Chanukah arrives?

Place the candles in the chanukiah (Chanukah menorah) from right to left.

How many candles are used?

On the first night of Chanukah one light is kindled. On the following night, two lights and so on until on the eighth night, eight lights are kindled. This does not, of course, include the shammas which is the candle used every night to light the other candles of the day.

Where does the chanukiah go?

If possible the chanukiah should go near or at a window. In this way passersby can see the burning candles, which means according to Jewish tradition, that we have helped in the process of Pirsum Ha-nais—the Publicizing of the Chanukah Miracle and Story.

How do we light the candles?

Just after nightfall, say the blessings. The first two are said every night. The third is only said on the first night.

After the blessings light the candles by going from left to right so that the additional light of each night is kindled first.

Do we do anything different on Shabbat - Friday evening, December 14?

Yes. On that night we light the chanukiah first and after that Shabbat candles are lit. However, for a really good time, don't light candles at home. Bring yourself and your candles to Temple for a 6 pm. service followed by dinner and an amazing Chanukah event.


